Role Specifics

Job Purpose

Canteen has a vibrant and innovative research department that guides much of its clinical practices. This volunteer role directly supports the Impact Team and requires undertaking varied administrative and research tasks across a range of research and evaluation projects.

Duties and Responsibilities

Tasks typically include, but are not limited to:

- Conducting literature searches and reviews
- Writing summaries
- Completing data entry and cleaning
- Performing basic data analysis and interpretation
- Assisting with preparing reports and presentations
- Managing references using EndNote
- Assisting with general administrative and ad hoc research tasks

This role requires working with multiple members of the Impact Team.

The role requires the ability to work from home. If you live in Sydney, there may also be opportunities to work with the Impact team at Canteen's Newtown office



Role Specifics

Essential

- Completed at least 2 years of an undergraduate Psychology degree or similar
- Experience conducting literature searches
- Ability to use SPSS or similar statistical package
- Intermediate level Microsoft Word and Excel skills or above
- Knowledge of basic statistical analyses
- Eagerness to learn new skills and topics and the flexibility to adapt to quick changes in priorities

Desirable

- Ability to use EndNote or similar reference management software
- Experience using online survey management systems such as Qualtrics
- Intermediate Microsoft PowerPoint or above
- Experience with visual representation of data (eg graphs, infographics) or willingness to learn
- Experience with qualitative research methods (eg coding responses) or willingness to learn

This role may involve working from home, so access to suitable computer equipment and internet will be required.

Hours of work

We ask that volunteers commit to a minimum of 6 hours, 1 day per week.

We are also asking volunteers to commit to the role for a minimum of 6 months.

We know this is a large commitment of time, but it is vital to ensure our Impact team has the consistency required to ensure excellent outcomes.

Pre-engagement checks

As Canteen's work involves staff being in direct contact with children and young people, all staff, whether paid or unpaid are required to complete police and working with children checks, relevant to the state in which they will be engaged. Canteen also requires all staff, paid our unpaid to be fully vaccinated for COVID-19.

Canteen may conduct at least two reference checks on successful applicants and may also require proof of any professional qualifications stated on an application.
